



## Kathryn Viola Groce

April 16, 1930 - March 20, 2026

Kathryn V. Groce, 95, of Goldsboro MD passed away peacefully at the home of her daughter and son-in-law, surrounded by family on Friday March 20, 2026. She was born on April 16, 1930, in Burrsville, DE to the late Ethel Virginia Benson. Upon the death of her mother at the age of 2, she was raised in Denton MD, by the late Nettie Baynard whom she considered family. She attended Lockerman School in Denton MD graduating in May 1948 with a full scholarship to Hampton University in Hampton Virginia. She declined the scholarship and instead married the love of her life, the Late Rayfield Groce, Jr. on December 25, 1948. She was an avid crocheter and seamstress and was a stay-at-home wife for the majority of her life, until her children became teenagers, and she accept a cooking position at the Benedictine School, retiring in 1999 after 19 years. She attended Trinity AME Church in Ridgely MD regularly until her health began to fail.

In addition to both mothers, she is predeceased by her husband, Rayfield Groce, Jr., favorite Uncle Clearence Benson (Hulda) and nephew Irvin Groce.

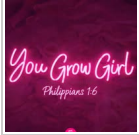
