Marvin Russell "Popeye" Taylor of Denton, Maryland passed away on October 13, 2021. He was 71.

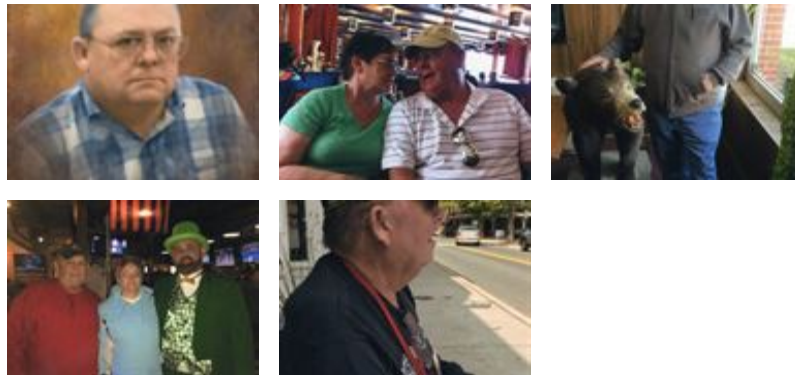
